## THERE'S AN ANDY WARHOL DICK PIC ON THE MOON

In the 1960s, artist Forrest Myers wanted to send some art to the moon. Myers, John Chamberlain, David Novros, Claes Oldenburg, Robert Rauschenberg and Andy Warhol drew images, which were printed on postage stamp-sized ceramic wafers by an engineer at Bell Labs. Myers had no official backing for the project, but an engineer working on Apollo 12 agreed to secrete a wafer on a leg of the lunar module, which was left on the moon after the mission. Andy Warhol's contribution to the project was "his initials". Currently, the only evidence that the wafer is on the moon comes from a telegram sent to Myers by the engineer when he had done the deed, but his identity is still a mystery.
